During the past two years I have made a large number of lantern slides from Engravings, Diagrams and other subjects for use in lectures at Cornell University. The departments of

are now making extensive use of this method of illustration, and the experience I have had in supplying their needs has enabled me to do this work in a superior manner and with promptness.

Slides may be made from any Wood Cuts, Engravings, or Photographs you may furnish, or from any material in the library or collections of Cornell University. In the case of standard works which are to be found here, all that is necessary is to give title of book, page and No. of figure. The Architectural collection here includes many rare and costly works, and several thousand large photographs, all of which are available for copying purposes.

All slides are made on the best thin English glass, of the uniform size $3\frac{1}{4} \times 4$ inches, neatly mounted in black plate paper.
