Dear Sir

Referring to the post-script of your letter of the 18. I take pleasure in informing you that Dr. Storrs has kindly consented to occupy the platform with you on both evenings Jan. 2. + Jan. 9. and will open the service as you request with reading the Scripture and Prayers, on the first night—possibly both nights.

As I mentioned, there will be no service in the Church of the Pilgrims (Dr. Storrs) on the first Sunday in Jan on account of the Communion service which is held from 4<sup>30</sup> to 6. P.M.

I called to see Dr. Storrs this morning, and suggested to him the propriety of omitting the evening service on the 1<sup>st</sup> of Jan. and while he felt unwilling as a rule to give up <sup>the</sup> evening service yet he for his part considered it advisable provided the Trustees agreed with him. Just then Mr Walter T. Hatch of the board of Trustees came in and as he fully coincided with Dr. Storrs the Dr. said I might consider the matter set.
