I omitted to say in my last that the Lecture Committee will be happy to make any arrangement and conform to any suggestion you may offer in regard to these lectures. If you have any charts or wish to use the blackboard as Agassiz did we can provide anything you may desire if we know in time. Please call upon us freely as we want to do everything possible to facilitate your plans and make these lectures successful. We shall send out on Monday to all the school teachers in Brooklyn, admission tickets like enclosed, excepting of course the words "Step Ticket". There are 1700 teachers in the public schools alone and about 2000 to 2100
