and exposition, but it is

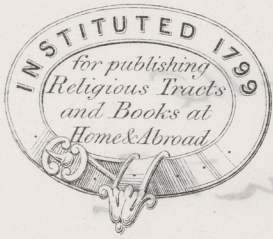
clear that from the impression
