Dear Sir William

Thank you for your

kind note. I am not quite well & Dr
Shepherd on the day of the Conversazione
warned me to keep quiet & not to expose
myself to draughts of air. So I followed
his advice. Though I had prepared a
pretty speech which I should have been
glad to pronounce at the gathering. I
remained here till July 6. & then proceeded
to Washington for a few days before
going on to Florida. I propose to return
again to Washington about April 1.

this week. With my hope & inter-
