My dear Sir William

Perhaps in that time I may be able to look over any material you may have from the Cambrian at (St. Michael?) Lower St. Lawrence. It is my purpose to spend a day at Point Lewis or may return to St. John, as I wish

to get some knowledge of
the fauna of the ^{Lower Cambrian} conglomerates
there, and of the Upper
Cambrian beds that maybe
exposed near Point Lewis.

possible that if I made it
shorter your engagements
might prevent me from seeing
you.

I shall bring down
my papers and drawings of
the trilobites which were not
called for as I wish to show
you the drawings especially
and especially those of the
genus Listracus Angelin.

is utterly rejected by the am-
erican palaeontologists.
