I am much obliged
for your letter of the 12th

by the Faculty. I do not fear
that the presence of both

sexes in the lecture-room will
deter any student from at-
tending the Additional classes;
in fact, I should not feel at-
tracted by the mental quality of
the student, whether man or woman,
who would object to receiving
instruction of University order
because it implied that com-
munity of intercourse in
Academic training which is up-

held in the affairs of Every day life.

If the meaning of the
Statement in the Calendar is,
as you suppose, "that in cases
in which the Additional is
part of the Honors course special
lectures will not be provided," I
must emphatically disclaim
any such meaning in regard
to our English work. Indeed
this touches the very reason for my
writing to you. In the English
Department the Additional course
contains matter peculiar to

itself but I have never intended
to duplicate my lectures in that
course and shall resist a entrance
and in a public and determined
manner any attempt to make
me do so. I find the present
repetition of lectures not only overous
but uniformly depressing and to
say any further burden on me in
this particular would compel me
to seek another field of labour
sooner than I shall be justified in
doing while my present surroundings
remain as they are.
