if possible.

You will also see
that it does not
anticipate any immediate
need of a storage battery;

and that if any
unforeseen delay should
occur he can begin

another subject in August,

instead of Fight; but
this would be left and
beneficial to the cause.

If we can get the
thing successful in person
it will be quite a
matter of importance as
putting us in advance of
the Canadian colleges
in this important matter
of electricity.
