For this I will cheerfully give the same remuneration (pitifully small, I am sorry to say,) that our Theological reviews pay, viz, \$2.00 per page, and in addition assure you that yr. contribution, at this particular stage, will add very much to the strength & prosperity of our enterprise. We do not wish more than from five to eight or ten pages (of 400 words each), & by no means an elaborate treatise is asked. The article is wished for our Department of "Notes", where living topics are treated, suggestively rather than elaborately. A short extract from ~~to~~ some of yr. recent lectures will answer admirably. Some topic like "The Bearing of Scientific Study on Practical Religion," or "The True Relation of Science & Religion," or "Evolution's Ethical Import," would be what we desire.
