My Dear Sir W<sup>m</sup>

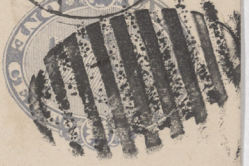
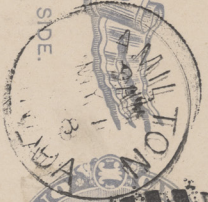
I deferred
