Dear Sir Charles,

Dr Samuel, Dr Suva
Dr Chaussean and I, as
representatives of the
Rogue Society, waited on
you yesterday at 4 P.M.
but were so unfortunate
as to find that Her
Majesty's very loyal opposition
claimed your attention at
the moment. We have
asked the Hon Secretary,
Mr Burrows, to endeavor
to arrange for an interview;

but as I have to return
to Montreal to-day, and
may consequently not be
of the party, I beg to say
that in my judgment it
would be wise to continue
the grant of \$5000 to the
Society. It has certainly done
some service to the Country,
and is now in a critical
stage of progress when the
withdrawal of its grant would
~~seriously~~ kill it, a result cer-
tainly not conducive to our
credit abroad or to our ma-
terial interests at home.

I have also taken the
liberty of leaving for your
papers relating to certain educa-
tional difficulties in the Province
of Quebec, which have been referred
to the Dominion Government. Very yours
