of the U.S. Ed of Paul Bert.

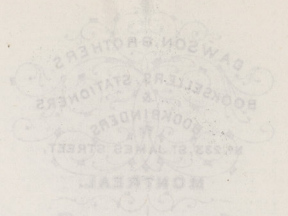
I have an idea of arranging

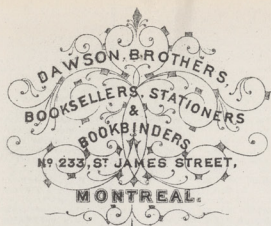

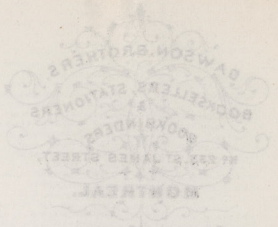
