In reply to yours of yesterday. I beg to say that I will do my best to have the specimens that Dr. Hinde wants, sent to him by next week's mail.

We (i. e. Tyrrell & myself) got about fifty species of fossils from the Devonian rocks of the northern end of Lake Manitoba, but on descending the Fairford River, en route for ~~the~~ Lake Winnipeg via the Little Saskatchewan, Tyrrell was prostrated by typhoid, & it took two weeks to get him down to the Winnipeg Hospital. He has had a long & dangerous illness, but fortunately is now convalescing rapidly, & is now probably at his home at Weston, near Toronto.
