I am favored with yours of the 30th ult. in reply to which I think it fair to say, that in connection with investments I have had occasion from time to time to make, it has come under my notice, that securities held by the late Mr Grant, which I had reason to believe were held for the Logan estate, were drawn in favor of Mr Grant personally, and not in his quality of Executor, or Manager.

If upon inquiry you find that securities belonging to the estate are so held, it will at once be apparent, that there is an important, and it may be, intricate settlement of accounts to be arrived at, between the estate of Sir W Logan, and the representatives of Mr Grant; this condition of matters would probably dis-
-qualify his son from representing the Logan estate, apart from the view that might be taken, of his youth and inexperience, in connection with the responsible duties, devolving upon one occupying the position held by his late father.
