I fear that I  
have never thanked you  
for sending me your last  
publication on Eozoon. A  
few days ago I called on  
Prof. Rupert Jones and  
Mr. Sherborn, in order to  
discuss the subject; the

Came to the Conclusion that  
something must be written in  
refutation of Mörkus' statements,  
Especially about the Tudor  
specimens & those others  
from Madoc. & elsewhere in which  
the Canal system is only  
partially infiltrated with  
serpentine - or contains  
dolomite - calcite etc.

Could you lend us over  
some more of these speci-

-mens which we could sub-  
-mit to Nicholson for Exam-  
-ination. He has always  
Expressed a great desire  
to Examine the Tudor speci-  
-men & I am writing to  
Prof. Selwyn about it.  
I suppose that we could  
not slice it much; but if  
you have your own  
sections of it, & could spare  
them, we should much  
like to see them. I imagine

that the specimens impregnated  
with Serpentine have been pretty  
fully dealt with already & that  
the whole question will turn  
on the cavals containing  
dolomite & calcite. I have  
always felt that the state-  
ments of my father and  
yourself upon that  
point have never been  
properly met by the  
other side.
