Dear Sir William:

The Curator of the Museum has found the Specimen labelled Hopl. phlebitum Bonessii but can find no photograph of it and the Photographer who did Dr. Huxleyman's photographing says he thinks he never photographed the Specimen & has not therefore the negative. He was not quite sure & may perhaps find it. In the event of his not finding it, would you like to have the Specimen photographed? I suppose it is to be done at your expense as the Commissioner was not generous enough to pay for it himself. Possibly however if you could let me know what is the doubtful point about the venation of the wing, I could decide the matter by inspection. Or, better, I could get Prof. Lawson who is well versed in the venation of ~~the~~ leaves, if not of wings, to examine the Specimen & decide the doubtful point.
