

Your postal is just received. I shall be very glad to see a new photograph of Haplophlebium, and hope you will send one also to Brongniart. My review being only of the last decade, I could not mention your discovery of the first paleozoic millepede which I do not think I have neglected to mention when occasion required. I mention the Devonian millepedes of Peach because it carried them back still another period, and was done during the last decade. It is curious that this was really first mentioned by Page in 1860 (only a year after your notice), who figured Kampecaris in his text-book but did not recognize it as a millepede
