

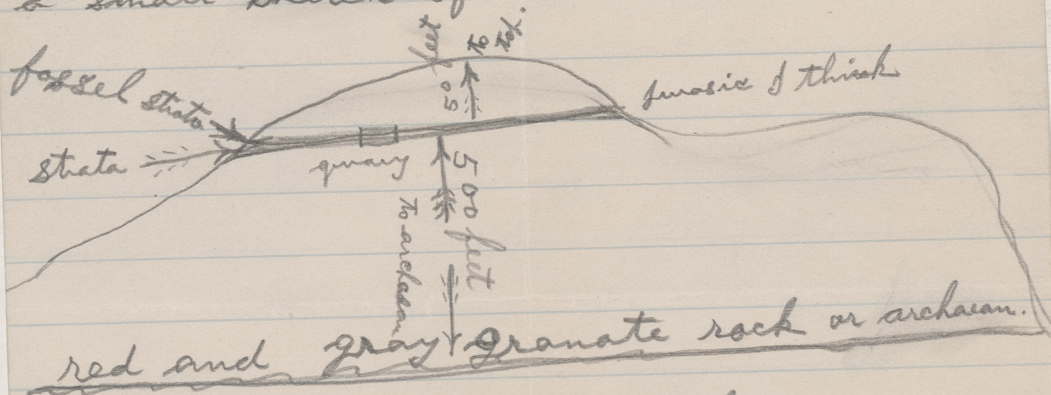
Canon City Colorado.

Sir William Dawson Dear Sir-
having learned of you by an acquaintance
of yours - that you were much interested
in geology and the fossils there in found;
I take pleasure in giving you a brief
discription of a discovery I have lately
made - 6 or 8 miles from Canon City by
trail, ⁶ or by county road 8 miles; and $\frac{3}{4}$ of a
from the S. & R. R. railroad; I have discovered
in a marl bed; and over laid by lithographic
lime stone & lime rock. the following fossils
or parts of them; a femur of the Dinosaur
weighing 511 pounds 5 feet 3 inches long; a vertebra
joint of the Enaliosaurus weighing 47 pounds &
measuring 13 inches a cross; a part of a
Pterosaur; and a grate variety of ball
and socket joints; ribs; teeth; and parts of

2 or 3 skulls all at the grass roots
as I have not gone in to the mountain 6 feet
yet; nor above 30 along its side; the
Mountain top contains something over 4 acres;
or the strata in which they are in; I have
taken out 3,000 pounds of bones and am
scarcely begun the work. I here with give you
a small sketch of the mountain —



I would like very much to have you come
and see this new find; there are several local
professors but none very far advanced. if you
can not come I should like to furnish you with
some fossils at reasonable price — let me
