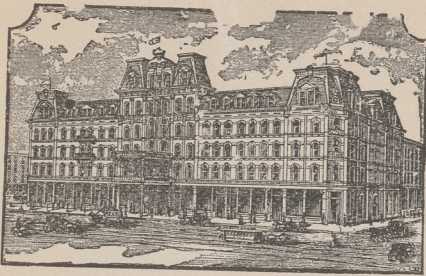

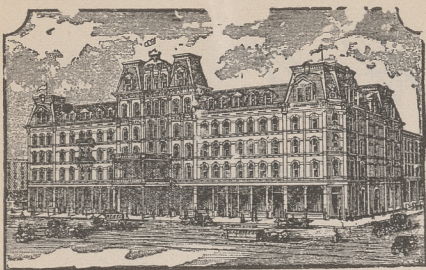

My dear Sir William

When I left Montreal I expected to be able to get back to Montreal to have a few hours with you before leaving for Albany but the loss of half a day in getting here and the amount of work here & the dance here will keep me quite up to the end of the day to-morrow and if I catch by the last train at 4:40 P.M. I can reach Montreal only about half past eight - and then I must leave on Sunday P.M. for Albany, in order to be in Washington at the meeting of the National Academy - where I have promised to be present.
