tunnels had been proved to your  
satisfaction by me at the  
British Association meeting when  
I last had the pleasure of  
talking to you and remembering  
how much you were astonished  
at the specimens and proofs I  
showed in support of my contention

I thought that in the body of  
your paper which was not all  
read there would be such reference  
to that paper of mine as  
would explain the remark that  
the opinion was not new.

However I strike out the whole  
clause so no question of the  
kind will arise —
