I beg to acknowledge
the receipt of your favor re
Oka Indians, based on the Gazette's
Report of our Gen. Conf. proceedings
which was written obviously with a
political bias. The fact is the
Conference favored the rigorous
policy which you desire. For my

part. I anxiously desire that the Indians
should no longer be pauperized and
demoralized by their present circumstances
but should remove to land they might
indisputably call their own & no longer
be harassed by the Seminary at Oka
whose title to the Ojibway is beyond
dispute in the opinion of the ablest lawyers
of the country. - However my views
have not prevailed and a policy
which certainly cannot be called "good"
has been adopted largely through the
influence of Mr. MacLaren. The probable
results of it - with reference to the Indians
I believe will be most disastrous. Thanking
you for your kind interest in the matter
