To Newberry's paper on the "Fossil Plants of
Nanaimo & V. I., Mr. Whiteaves' object is simply
this: To ascertain the date of publication of Keer's
Memoir & the ^{exact} number of forms of Cretaceous
plants described by Keer & Newberry in the two
works referred to.

Newberry's paper appears (from reference) to have
been published in 1863, ^{in the Proc. of the N. West. Soc.} but inasmuch as we
