Dear Mr Swett

Your favour of Dec 22 has been forwarded to me at this place to which I have gone for a short time as President for the last year of the Geological Society of America and to deliver a few lectures in the Lowell Institute, on a subject akin to that of the little book now in your hands.

I may say in the first place that the "Wedding Point" will in no way interfere with the "Sabertooths". The chapter on Early Man in the latter is from the geological side only and therefore on quite a different line. In the lectures here however and in the study of the magnificent material in the Peabody Museum of ethnology new facts suggest themselves; and I think it might be well that you should send me proof in slips that I might have opportunity to introduce a few new sentences. This would also facilitate the introduction of the illustrations.

In regard to the latter I have selected the following as new in England and useful:—

1. A tutular view of geological time to show the wenny of man.

2. A section by Holmes of the Kenton gravel bed supposed to hold implements

3. Two or three French and Belgian sections of cave deposits.

4. Heads of the Camaldt and Eugis races, and possibly one of later date

5. Some papers illustrating recent finds at Mentone.

6. Cartailhac's figure of the man of Saugerie Basse.

7. A few papers of characteristic implements, carvings &c of primitive men.

I can easily have the blocks of them made ~~in~~ in outline at small expense and very neat, and can send them by parcel post, and can place them with their numbers and titles on the slip proof.
