Owing to changes that are continually taking place here it may be possible that I may have to go if so it will be in the near future, and so I may not be able to travel along the Joggins Shore with you this Summer. I have worked hard for the company neglecting my health and family for the past eighteen months so that I could keep up my work which as been very heavy, in fact I have worked from 8<sup>am</sup> until 12 P.M. continuously.

I have no Engagement with the  
Company nor have I had one for  
over a year and I am liable  
to be thrown out at a moments  
Notice. Not having any sequen-  
-tance with the Board of Directors  
I have had to stand back and  
see others receive the appointments,  
Have you completed the examination  
of the remains sent you last fall  
or can you give an opinion upon  
them yet. If you write anything  
about them I would like to have  
a copy. I hope your health is  
improving this winter, and that  
you will be good and strong  
in the spring.
