I have much pleasure in informing you that your Tract upon "the Historical Deluge" was most cordially accepted by the Committee this morning, who desired me to express their thanks to you for your kindness in writing it for us -

May I venture with great diffidence to suggest one or two little matters raised by the Committee for your kind consideration - P 55. The numbers mentioned here do not come out quite clearly, some thought the 'plus' should be 'minus' others that the sentences should be transposed as in the copy I send - P 54 would you mind kindly stating a little more fully how you consider the waters subsided after the deluge. One or two other points I have ventured to mark upon the copy sent - We usually have an analysis of the argument at the beginning of the Tract - would you mind writing this as you would like it set out - The entire direction will then come on the next page - Would you also please insert the head-lines. But as the matter is then a page forward the head lines will be for the pages, how on the left hand & not on the right - As we shall have to add a little to the Tract be thought of inserting the Chaldean account of the deluge from George Smith's Records of the Past as an appendix unless there is anything you would prefer inserted -
