Dear Sir I wish to let you know that I have received your letter containing the keys of your house your telegraph also please say to Dr Harrington that I got his keys from the Cook the day you left here and went through all his house and found everything secure I was in your house today and every part seems to be secure before you left I have learned from the expressmen on my way to the station that their orders was to be at your house before 6 o'clock and they being fast and I slow I felt very sorry for your being worried so much I hope the guarantee Co will not need the keys I am very glad you all arrived safe and hope you will enjoy the summer season and arrive here in the very best of health

yesterday I spent a good part of the day with the architect Mr Taylor in your house east wing the front porch and steps is to be taken away all together and the offices to occupy your old kitchen and servants rooms the board room is to be where the office is at present the vaults or safes is to be where your coats used to be the furnace is to be in the cellar and your old library and drawing room with the hall taken away is to be one
