To Sir William Dawson

Dear Sir. Your favour of the 27th came in this morning. I have seen Mr Stary and arranged for the photographs of the Com. meeting to the 12th of September. I have also sent the film to Mr. Nichol an extract of your letter, and the sketches for the witness of Sr Corvick's service to the B.S. so I trust you will find all to your satisfaction, but if you think of anything else I shall be pleased to attend to it.

On the day of the funeral of Sr Corvick I was in the same carriage up to the Cemetery with Mr J. B. Douquet and he proposed that I should procure him a photo of Sr Corvick and myself, to be in the next issue of the Annual report. My reply was that I had every reason to think it would be very acceptable to our naval patrons for I had already spent eight or ten dollars to gratify the request of friends and not half of them were yet satisfied.
