But the idea of preparing a textbook under composite
authorship did not present itself to our minds until
after the early sheets had been set up. Hence also the
complication regarding the Monticuliporoids.

If there is room enough at the end, it is
our present purpose to prepare an Appendix, which
shall include besides a list of corrigenda, descriptions
of some of the more important American genera that
have been omitted in the body of the work. As editor of
the work, I should be sincerely grateful for any and
all corrections that may be sent in; many, I do not hes-
itate to say, have already been suggested. And for the
very reason that Cozoon and its allies occupies a prom-
inent place in the literature, no matter what individual
opinions may ~~be~~ exist concerning their nature, I should be
glad to give it a place - or rather, a brief statement con-
cerning it, a place, - in the proposed Appendix. Were you
minded to prepare a brief account especially for this work, I should
be pleased to communicate further on the subject.
