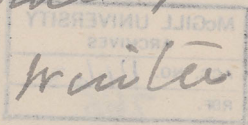

winter without trouble.



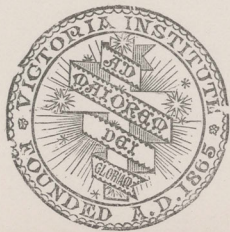
In England the weather

Rain from Switzerland
to Italy and as a last

expedition to Cortina (Campello)
and I was asked for a
description by the Archbp of

Dublin's committee, I
send you copies of both
my accounts of my visits
to Count Campello. They
each will show how Italy
has suffered from the rains.

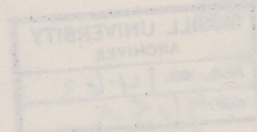
