It is all important I think that these surveys shall be continued, and I am sure the shipping interest will do everything possible to put pressure to bear upon the Government to this end.

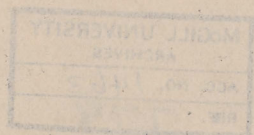
