Dear Sir Wm Dawson

Since I received your
letter of the 29th March my
sister Miss E. Stewart, my
brother James & I have been
endeavouring, unsuccessfully
I regret, to find any maps,
notes or letters of my uncle
the late Sir Wm Logan, after
his retirement from the Survey,
connected with the geology
of Eastern Canada.

The only map here is the

1866 map engraved in Paris
published by Stanford Ho.
These gentlemen know nothing
of any later map.

If any map or notes
were left in Wales by Mrs
E. Jones, my Brother James as
her executor would have known
of them & afterwards I, as
Mrs. Jones's executor would have
received them here.

My Brother James knows
that my Uncle was always
at work on the map of which
you allude & as we can find
nothing of it here & no notes,
I cannot help thinking that after
Sir W. Jones's death, Mr. Jones

must have sent his notes with
the map to Canada, either to
yourself, Mr. Selwyn or
Mr. Grant, with the idea of
assisting the survey & also
decisions that Sir D^r's work
should not be lost.

Mr. A. Jones was so good
a woman if business & all
his papers & letters were so
carefully separated & deposited
that I am sure if there were
anything here, we should
find it at once.

If I discover anything
further I will write to
you again.

I am obliged for the enclosed
& the information you give me
about the property of Mr.
Williamson.
