We enjoyed very much a short visit from Mr. Rudolf from whom we were glad to hear of the welfare of your daughter Eva.

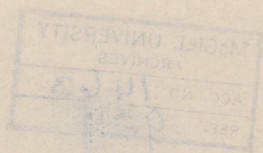
I need not say what
