My dear Sir William,

On my return to the city to-day I have your favor of the 13th of October in re the "Douk Hobors" and have handed your letter to Dr. Cunliffe of our editorial staff. He has met Mr. Aylmer Maude the representative of the English Committee of the Society of ^{Friends?} France and tells me that gentleman is now in Toronto but intends to come back to Montreal in a day or two and contemplates holding a public meeting to excite an interest on behalf of these poor people. From what I understand the Dominion Government give them the land and that is all they get from any Government or indeed from anybody here, so far as any arrangements have yet been made. The chief help comes through Mr. Maude and the people he represents. I have not met that gentleman myself but am almost sure to see him on his return to the city, and I have no doubt he would be very glad to call on you if you care to meet him. Meantime, we will do what we can to help Mr. Maude to excite an interest on behalf of these poor people of the Russian provinces.

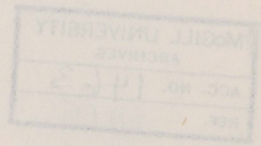

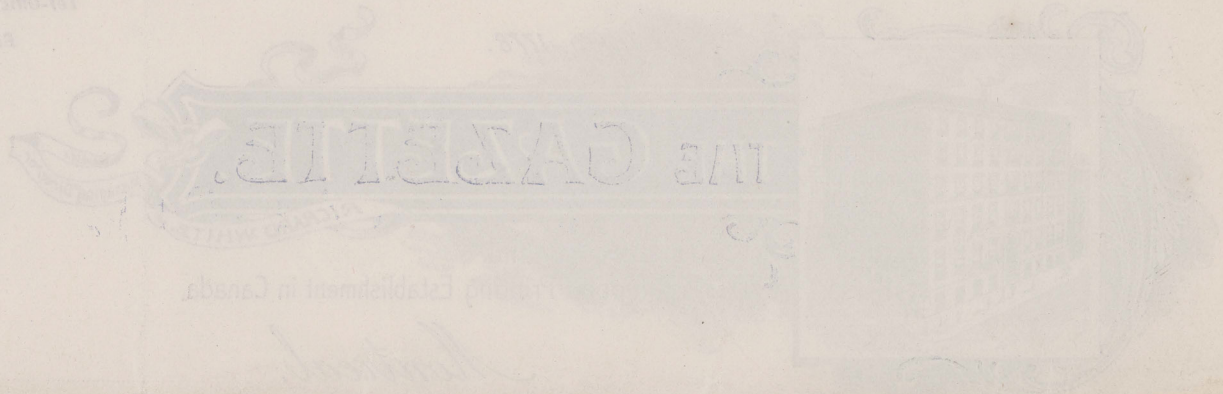
