

Dear Sir

Having now obtained  
a number of the shells which  
you mentioned as rare with you  
I send you a parcel which I  
hope you will receive safely -

They are *Pect. Magellanicus* of which I  
send a number of shells of small size  
I can get no large ones near Pictou.

*Modiola Papuana* of which there is abun-  
dance at the mouth of our Harbour &  
*M. Plicatula* of which I have lately found  
one or two beds where their shells can be  
easily obtained.

*Offithea Cornuta* is very scarce here. I  
send all that I have been able to get  
Of the large *Mastra* I have been able  
to find only one moderately large specimen.



and some small ones - These I send  
Purpura Lappillus I send all the large  
ones that I have at present - One of  
them is of a size uncommon even here

Natica Heros. This shell is not found  
here of so large size as in some places  
near the mouth of the St Lawrence.

Nucula & Lymnaea. I send all the spec-  
imens I have - can get no more till next spring

Littorina This small species is abundant  
here It is found among bladder wrack &  
on stones on the shores of the Harbour, along  
with a larger species (also sent) which I sup-  
pose to be the same with your L. Palliata

Beside the species formerly sent I  
have since found and put up for you

Ancodon & Unio, East River, Pictou, the best speci-  
mens I have at present

Plicatula. St. Lawrence river (not common)  
Paludina - Cambo Harbour & Pictou

I have in addition to these found *Buccinum*  
*Senatum* & *Cerithium Sayi* though rather scarce <sup>here</sup>

*Buccinum undatum* and *Astarte*  
*castanea* are Bay of Fundy shells and  
 not found here, At Parborough they can  
 be picked up on the beach in almost any  
 number

I have not yet received specimens of  
 the *Helix* from Antigonish but am  
 promised them soon

Having obtained a few specimens of  
*Senecio*
