IMPORTANT NOTICES
TO
HOLDERS OF COOK'S TRAVELLING COUPONS.

No Coupons must be withdrawn from the Books except by the Ticket Collectors; but Passengers must see that the proper leaves are withdrawn or clipped for each section of the Tour.

No bound Book of Travelling Coupons from which a leaf is withdrawn can be accepted for repayment; and no repayments for unused Books of Travelling Coupons can be made, except at the Chief Office, Ludgate Circus, London. No agent is authorised to make any repayments. *Entire Books of Travelling Coupons will be repaid at a reduction of 10 per cent. (all Steamship Tickets and Swiss Railway Tickets excepted)* if returned within one month from the date of issue. Hotel Coupons, in Books or detached, will be repaid in the same manner. Partly-used, clipped, or mutilated Travelling Coupons cannot be accepted for repayment.

It should be borne in mind that Cook's Travelling Coupons are issued by THOMAS COOK & SON, in their capacity as Agents for the various Railway, Diligence, and Steamship Companies, and that they cannot be responsible for errors, either on the part of the Passengers or of officials, arising from non-compliance with the instructions, which are plainly printed in the cover of every book of Coupons.

N.B.—Passengers returning from the Continent, *viâ* Calais or Ostend and Dover, are particularly requested to register their Luggage to Victoria, Holborn, or Ludgate Hill Stations, and to ask, on landing at Dover, for the *Chatham and Dover train*. Luggage registered to Ludgate Hill or Holborn is examined at Dover.

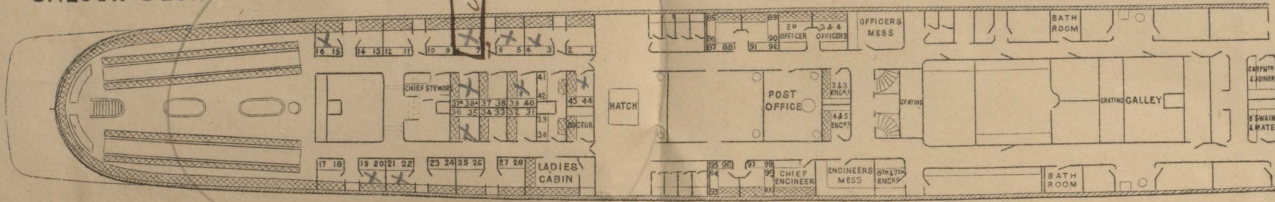

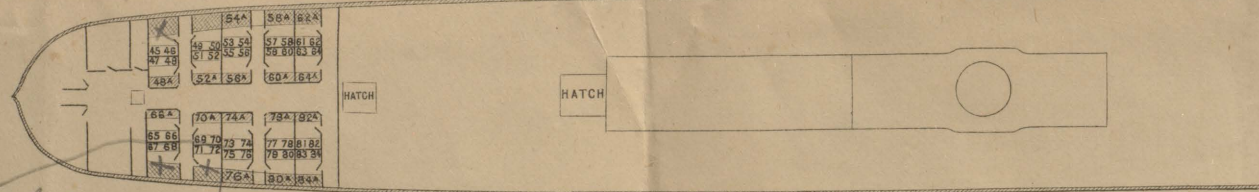
SALOON DECK

ODD NUMBERS ARE THE LOWER BERTHS.

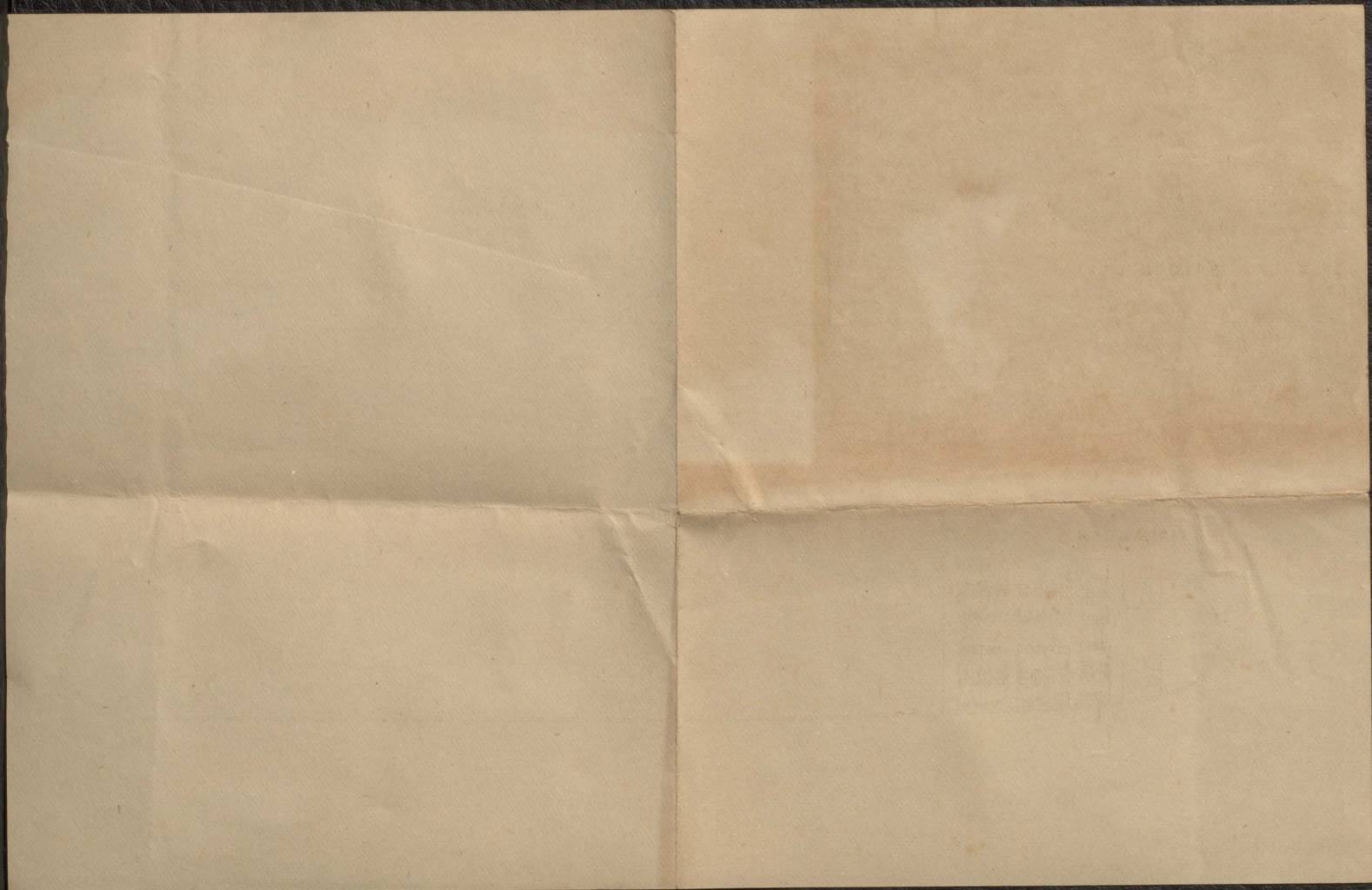
