Dear Papa.

I called last week at Somerset House & payed your subscriptions for the Ray Paleont. & Quarterly journals. I got receipts for them.

The Organic Chemistry lectures began yesterday & will I think occupy about two months. As for they have been very interesting, but give me lots of work again reading & writing notes.

I am now working at the qualitative  
analysis of mixtures at the laboratory  
& will be some time getting through  
them. When you come you  
might if convenient bring any ~~old~~ old  
broken pieces of Copper, iron, or other ores  
which you have lying about, & of which  
you know the localities of course it is  
much more interesting to work with them  
& besides you may exchange them for others  
of the same kind with the students.
