My dear Father,

I have been obtaining a few further items of information about the subject of "missions". Lemaire knows something of them as he has met some of the Engineers during their mission, & has also other means of knowing. He says that a person can go to his "mission" at any time he chooses during the holidays. It seems also that the ticket for half-fare applies to the whole set of lines under one company, & enables one at ~~any~~ any time to get a ticket at half-price over their roads. Also ~~if~~ in regard to changing ones locality, one is not required to stay in connection with the "mission" any longer than he chooses, & if wishing to change can either avail himself of the general recommendation

from the School which can be presented to the Engineer in chief at the locality in question; or can get a recommendation from the one he has been under.

There does not seem to be anything very special contemplated for next summer. All that I can hear of, is that some railways are in progress in the south, and also that at Marseilles there are always harbour improvements which are being executed. If one were to get a recommendation (or whatever they call it) to the Chemin de fer du Midi this would give one the whole range of the south coast, & would probably be the best field at present.

Lemaire's father has several factories in Algeria, & he intends to go there on a mission & make it a visit at the same time. He can get there from Marseilles for nothing as the line of steamers belongs to the government. If anything special were going on there it would not be a bad place. I believe too there are some railways contemplated I saw in the "Guide" the other day

that the Govern^t of Holland had voted
a sum toward the dredging & reclamation
of the Zuider Zee. I have not been able
to obtain any further information on the
subject, however. It would be a fine en-
terprise to obtain connection with, if it
is really contemplated. — I have not
heard anything lately in regard to the Channel
Tunnel, but I would not be particularly
anxious to connect myself with that, as
there is nothing of the kind possible in
Canada. If I wanted to study that subject
now the St Gotthard tunnel would be much
better. — I would prefer to get some
work in Canada for next summer or
the whole, as it would probably prove more
useful to me on the whole as practice.

When the question is largely one of seeing
what is going on, one can see this in
Mother wrote to me in her last
about the possibility of coming out before
the last exams were over. I have made
further inquiries from the librarian about
this, & am told by him that the last
is on the 21st or 22nd May, & that
they are placed at intervals of 5 days

apart. If I were to miss any of them I would have to return here on the 1st October to pass them as supplementals. I might however be able to arrange to be examined before the others although it would put me ~~at~~ somewhat at a ~~dis~~ disadvantage in giving me less time to prepare; still this would only give me a difference of 5 days, but might be worth while. The results are declared on the 24th May.

I learn from the Secretary that the Council have not yet decided on the date of the exams & will not do so for some weeks yet.

I enclose the list of work for the second & third years of the School. There are no exceptions nor alternatives, unless I were to become an auditeur libre & merely attend the lectures in which case I would lose all the drawing or travaux intérieurs. I will also send the list of lectures. We do not have Droit administrative.
