Fort Fraser, Fraser Lake B.C.
Sept 3. 1876.

Dear Father,

I write this short note by a chance which offers, but which may or may not carry it through to mail in reasonable time, — just to let you know of my continued welfare.

We had a very rough country between the place at which my last was dated, & this. A mass of mudfall & thick timber & other abominations; & with the bargain bad weather. By sticking to it we made the trip in twenty-five days, arriving on the Telegraph Trail, just as our

promiscuous were almost entirely out,
owing to the great time occupied, I find,
that Mr Cambie has now been about a
week gone on his Francois Lake trip. He
intends to leave the Lake sometime, & go across
the country to the south in some direction he
has heard of as being practicable, with a
number of Indians to carry his stuff.
As soon as I can fit the arrangements
made, I propose starting to Circumnavigating
Francois Lake on my own account. This
may take ten days, after which I may
go down the ne-cla-ko River to
Fort George, sending the pack animals
round New to meet me.
I do not write at length, feeling

uncertain as to the promptitude with which this
letter will reach General.
