My dear Father,

I enclose the reply of the Minister of Public works, as posted in the School. We are not altogether satisfied with his decision, as it gives us ~~not~~ no title, and although called a diploma, is not really more than a certificate. As to the "particularly distinguished" we will see what that means at the end of this session. It is probably only a reservation, <sup>in order</sup> so that the authorities may not be pledged to give it to all the élèves; for it is very seldom that any of them are stopped in the last year.

The cours préparatoire has proved  
quite a success. Sixteen élèves externes  
entered this year, eleven of them being from  
the preparatory class. Delaroz who was  
with us last year has remained in the  
first year; leaving only five who have  
entered directly.

I have not yet been to Gil's as I  
have enough money to last to the end of  
the year. I have arranged with Mme de  
Prudel to let me have the room I now  
occupy for 35 francs a month, as Audouin  
had it at that price last year; and I have  
agreed to remain there both this winter &  
next. I paid 40<sup>f</sup> last winter, and am  
very well satisfied with the arrangement  
I have made, as it is very much pleasanter  
to have a permanent address, & moving is  
always troublesome. The flat that Dorian  
& I are in is meant for a small fam-

ily, & has a kitchen besides the bedrooms.  
This we have for keeping our fuel in. There  
is also a small room that was supposed to  
go with the bedroom I had last year, where  
we can put our trunks. These are conveniences  
which one would not meet with every where.  
I find the stove in my room a very good one  
& more serviceable than an open fire-place;  
which amounts to saying that it is more eco-  
nomical. There are a couple of little gratings  
near the top from which hot air issues,  
which I suppose comes from outside; and  
hence the draft must ventilate the room quite  
as well as in the case of an open fire-place.

Herbert & old<sup>2d</sup> Reddy are now  
in Paris. They arrived on Sunday morn-  
ing, & M<sup>rs</sup> R. leaves this morning  
at 11 A.M. for Cannes, a town on the  
Mediterranean east of Marseilles where  
she is to spend the winter.

She is going in company with a Mrs  
Ross (I think) from Dublin, (who has a large  
house at Naomha) & who is accompanied  
by Dick McDonald. Herbert is staying  
a few days here before returning to London  
& I have asked him to come & see me  
this evening. We went to an English  
Methodist Church together on Sunday evening

The principal event of the week consists  
in my having invested in a Beaver hat.  
I went to a place Dorian recommended  
& got a really good one, for which I gave  
17<sup>£</sup> (\$3.40) I do not wear it every  
day; but it is almost necessary to have  
one here for Sundays, & visits.

The papers here give very full ac-  
counts of the Eastern Question. Most of the  
telegrams are copied from English & German  
papers of the day before, & acknowledged to  
be so. Believe me

The following is the text of the reply  
of the Minister of Public Works to the request  
made last year by the Élèves Externes to grant  
them a diploma instead of a certificate.

(Posted at the School this week.)

L'Inspection général, Directeur de l'École,  
porte à la connaissance de M. G. les Élèves Externes  
la décision suivante prise par M. le ministre des  
Travaux publics, le 24 juillet, 1876.

Messieurs les Élèves Externes de l'École des  
Ponts et Chaussées ont adressé à l'Administration  
de l'École une demande tendant à  
obtenir que le diplôme qui leur est délivré à  
leur sortie de l'École fut modifié de manière  
à faire ressortir leur aptitude à exercer la pro-  
fession d'Ingénieur. Le Conseil de l'École  
a donné à cette demande une très sérieuse  
attention, et il lui a paru qu'un diplôme  
exceptionnel devait être conféré aux Élèves  
Externes qui se seraient distingués d'une  
manière spéciale dans le cours de leurs études.  
Cette question a été de ma part l'objet  
d'une sérieux examen, et il m'a paru qu'il

Y avait lieu d'accueillir en principe la proposition du Conseil de l'Ecole. J'ai décidé en conséquence que les élèves externes qui se seront particulièrement distingués pendant le temps qu'ils auront passé à l'Ecole recevront un diplôme d'ancien  
'Élève externe de l'Ecole des Ponts et Chaussées  
apté à exercer la profession d'Ingénieur.

Quant aux autres élèves ils continueront à recevoir comme aujourd'hui un certificat constatant qu'ils ont suivi les cours de l'Ecole et ont satisfait aux conditions réglementaires.
