I saw Cates - in lecture I think - that one of the grants in aid of research - a small one - was given to Rowney & King to aid investigation of Opilites; so that we may expect something more of Counterblast to Eozoon soon.

As the result. In this country much of the probable Carboniferous is attested to about the stage of Sauroctonus, & the other early series pro nata, but we get true Coals &c in Cretaceous & Tertiary. This by the way I fear older rocks are fused for recognition. You will remember soon.
