Geneva Sep. 4. 1880

My dear Father,

We arrived here this morning & hoped to have found letters from home, but have been disappointed in this. They are doubtless waiting our return to Geneva. It is proposed to buy ten tomorrow, leave next day for Turin. Leave Turin next, (Thursday) morning & so to Geneva the same night. Half a day in Geneva to get money & then via Sausanne, Berne, Zurich, down the Rhine to Cologne, Brussels, Antwerp, Harwich & London. Too much yet to me I know, but we may be able to sail on Oct. 28 or Nov 4th, more probably the latter. When in London I

of finding nearly everyone away, & so did
not attempt to see, Husley, Parker,
or Macmillan. I have these notes
talking to you the way back & will
also try to see Poe, for the purpose
