My dear Father,

We leave this afternoon for Montpelier, from which we will work down the Glubencadie Basin to Waverley. I have taken today for business in Halifax, which has not lost us any time as it happened to be wet. This is the first wet day since we have been in Dartmouth, 13 days. I am glad to see in the "Christian" that a Misere age for man has been abandoned at the York Association, and a Post Glacial age generally adopted. I trust this is correct; and I am sure you will be gratified to think how much you have contributed towards this change of opinion.
