Dear Father

It seems to me that I do nothing but write home, & that without having anything in particular to communicate. I have been at Marseilles several days, in a very comfortable hotel, but decided to leave this evening & so came on here by the afternoon train. Here are I believe some Roman antiquities of interest here, which I meant go & see tomorrow, & may then go on to Cete by the rag. train. The Fete National was celebrated while I was at Marseilles, at

the expense of a great quantity  
of gunpowder & fire-works. The  
town looked very pretty, however, all  
illuminated. The weather was rather  
warm, but not anything like the  
heat we experience in Canada  
at times. Today it is quite  
pleasantly cool, & beautifully  
bright & clear. I wrote a  
postal to Arthur, Clegg or King  
him & send any letters which  
might have reached him to  
Marselles, but heard from  
him in reply that there were  
none by the last mail. I may  
perhaps get some at Doulonie  
in a few days. I have not  
seen anything of particular  
geological interest lately, except  
the altered Chalk rocks of the

part of France. At Marnecelles  
almost marble. There are  
some lignite mines about 20  
miles north of Marnecelles, but  
the weather was so warm, the  
trains left so early in the morning,  
& above all it was so stoppered  
there for all alone that I  
did not manage to wake up  
my mind to go & see them.  
There is a very fine museum  
at Marnecelles, & well arranged,  
but though in an exceedingly  
handsome building, from a  
hat but partly view the  
collections are not so good  
as those at Lyons. There

Particulars in minerals, are  
despatched the second a/c to Paris.  
What they seem to like most to  
furnish museums with here,  
are old tombstones & such  
like. They don't appear to be  
the very interesting. "Sarcophagus  
of a noble Roman lady" might  
certainly be utilized as a  
tomb-stone, but roughly hewn  
out of a piece of Sandstone or  
limestone porches or intrinsic  
beauty. Kind regards to
