My Dear Father,

I wrote to Eva at
some length the other day,
& have not much to add
since. Have been going
about in a leisurely manner,
& have seen I think nearly
all I care to see here.

Many of the stock Churches &
persons little or no interest
to me. Tomorrow I think
I shall have finished, & then
propose going on to Naples

to see resources & Pompeii
 after which I shall be on the
 Inward track. There are
 three available ways of going
 from Rome to England.

1. by the Riviera to Marseilles
 & then direct to Paris. 2. by
 through Pullman car from
 Rome to Paris via the Louis
 tunnel. 3. from north Italy
 by the Brenner Pass to Munich
 & thence either to Paris or
 to Antwerp ^{or}. The last would
 I think be the most interesting but
 longest as one would have
 to stay several nights on the
 way to make any use of the

journey. When I get back
 I'll come on the return I must
 reckon up the time as to
 sailing of steamers & &
 decide. I must have at least
 two days in London even
 if I do not pay my visit
 to the Redpaths. Then I
 shall probably have to go to
 Edinburgh for two or three
 days, & the Crows ask me
 to stay a day or two with
 them in Liverpool, so that
 I begin to find it very
 hard work getting out before
 & now, & may perhaps work

able to manage it though I
should like to do so if possible.

What I really began to write this morn-
ing, however, is the following.

I think my subscription to the
Rideau Club Ottawa, expires
either the first or last of December
& should like to pay it before it
does so. It is either \$20 or

\$25 - I forget which. If not

too much trouble you would
oblige by writing to Secretary
