Sep. 5th 1845

Dear Sir William,

I am sorry that you have had so much trouble about my boxes, but hope that they will not give you further annoyance. The statement which you have given with regard to their contents is I believe correct. I cannot see how Mr Reynolds mixed them up with the chemical apparatus as my letter to him concerning them never mentioned ~~them~~ chemical apparatus. The latter should have arrived several weeks ago

and if it has not turned up
I shall have to write about
it.

The weather here is
fine though rather cold.
Last evening we had the
first aurora that I ever
saw - brilliant purple and
green & covering the whole
heavens.

All are well here and
expect to leave on Wednesday
next. I wrote on Wednesday
to Moncton for places in the
Pullman but have no reply
as yet.
