My dear Father,

I have just read through your
note on the Fossil Plants etc making one
or two little corrections. As there appears
to be no immediate necessity for printing
I think I will take it down with me next
week as there are a few points which
I should like to discuss. If the
R. Soc. paper has not yet been finally
printed off the corrections above referred
to might be made in it. If it has
gone to press such as you think worth
while may appear in Emata. I am
sending today, prepaid, four boxes of
fossil plant material from West Coast

when I am done I will try to take
 time to unpack & go over it. Till I
 know it had better remain in boxes
 for fear of mixture. I will also
 send tomorrow by freight, not prepaid,
 the barrel of fish (sole) of which
 I spoke when last in Montreal. If
 this arrives before I do it had better
 be put in cool place & opened to
 see if the pickle has leaked out &
 needs renewal
