soon, but my going will
depend upon my father's
condition. Sunday night
he was very low and
quite unconscious all
night. Since then he
has rallied a little, but
still I fear that his recovery

is very doubtful. At present he suffers more from weariness than from absolute pain.

Mr Pitt was up from Coma again this week and has been exceedingly kind.
