My dear Father,

I write you a line
to let you know of how well I
am & that I am well. From this
place I intend putting in a few days
with the Traders, to the westward &
then working on the east of the river,
toward Clinton, where I shall hope
to get a mail again. I have had
no letters nor in a couple of
weeks & could not arrange to
get mail here, as there is only a
weekly stage communication with
Clinton & no telegraph. The weather
has been broken lately, some rain
& much wind, with sprinkling of

been snow on the mountains,
 altogether most unseasonable & a
 month or six weeks too early.
 Probably we may see snow, however,
 a return of good weather for a time.
 This is a most picturesque place
 with well varied views of mountain
 cliff & river than most places
 in consequence of the slope of the Fraser
 valley & the junction of the Lillooet
 River valley.
