Camp near Clinton, Pa.
1. October. 1889

My dear Father,

I have now walked
my devious way to this
place, & having sent to Kankakee
by mail, hope to get the accumulation
of three weeks or so tomorrow.
I don't now get in answer to
any of your news, but simply to
keep you informed of my whereabouts.
It is raining today & for the
last few days the weather has
been broken with a tendency
to snow on all the higher hills.
It begins to look as if the
autumn ~~was~~ is likely to be
as advanced as the spring was

I hope, however, to get in a couple of weeks yet so that I may finish up this career of the warp & not have to come back over it again. If I can manage to do this I shall then strike back to Humbergs & close work for the season.

I hope your new arrangements at the College show signs of working satisfactorily during the session, & if all goes well shall hope to be in Montreal myself before the end of this month.
