I have found a new seedling by mail the volume containing the description of Alaskan plants to which you refer. Some of them look like my plants. I have little knowledge of the age of the beds, but they have been referred to as Miocene & supposed to be of the same age with the 'Miocene' of B.C. Coast. Cretaceous rocks however, do occur on Alaskan Coast but apparently chiefly lower Cretaceous.

The Indian aid Soc., to which you refer is an institution which Mr Wilson of Soledad wants is unnecessary to get up, but I think it will be difficult to combine the mission & scientific aspects. He has written two times about it, but I do not propose taking any active part in his Society.
